- National Volunteer Service Program (NVSP): This <u>impact evaluation</u> from the
 World Bank presents evidence from Lebanon on the impact of offering a volunteering
 program that consists of inter-community volunteering activities and soft skills
 training on social cohesion values. The results show that youth who were selected to
 participate were more likely to report higher tolerance values as well as a stronger
 sense of belonging to the Lebanese community roughly one year after the
 completion of activities.
- Digital Divide Data (DDD): This annual <u>report</u> talks about new directions DDD took in 2018, the accomplishments over the past year and plans for 2019.

• **Educate!:** Educate!'s Uganda Deputy Country Director, Hawah Nabbuye, conducted research on gender-sensitive pedagogy and girls' education in Uganda as part of the Echidna Global Scholars program at the Brookings Institution.

- A Toolkit for Informality Scenario: This toolkit is a spreadsheet-based toolkit
 that allows researchers and practitioners to project the size of formal and informal
 labor, production, and growth in almost 100 countries yearly until 2040.
- Banking on the Future: Youth and Digital Financial Services in Sub-Saharan
 Africa: This <u>field note</u> summarizes insights on youth uptake and usage of DFS from
 a cross-section of studies over the last six years, and recommends, for example,
 that providers can better reach out to the youth by offering savings accounts,
 checking or prepaid accounts, and micro loans.
